The poet Victor Depta, in his book The Helen Poems, writes of his teen daughter in the poem *Tuition Costs*:

I'd raised a child, practically  
as if the end were something I'd thought about  
prepared for, worked toward  
when, in fact, I was amazed how little time was left  
what with the ACT, SAT, the mailbox cluttered with college ads

loan forms, tuition costs, room and board  
as if I were packaging her, fully insured  
for Berkeley, Davis, somewhere deliverable to  
and tampered with, probably  
opened like a certified intelligence.

I'd raised a child  
as if a million million hadn't done the same  
yet it was fresh to me, fragrant as irises  
as the climbing rose on the back porch  
where I kept myself busy to distract myself

sawing fretwork, attaching it to the posts  
and painting everything white, white as the roses  
wonderfully unreal, a dream-labor  
old fashioned as the moon in May, delicate  
as she readied to go away.

The poignancy he feels as he prepares to launch his daughter off to college and into adulthood is something to which we parents (especially parents of seniors!) can relate. The process of "letting go" can be a challenge. You have carefully guided and helped select the choices your son or daughter has made to this point, including choosing Christian Brothers as the special place to prepare him or her for college. We at CB have labored diligently in partnership with you to provide a strong academic foundation and intellectually vibrant community to best prepare your student

for higher education. That is part of our mission as a college-preparatory school.

Enjoy this moment with him or her, knowing these wonderful years at Christian Brothers will be over all too soon. May all of us exemplify for our kids the priorities of unconditional love and a "big picture" view of the purpose and meaning of a Christian Brothers education.

## ANNOUNCEMENT OF NEW PRINCIPAL

We are pleased to announce the appointment of **Raymond John Burnell** as Principal of Christian Brothers High School effective July 1, 2005.

Mr. Burnell comes to Christian Brothers with eighteen years experience in Catholic education. He has served the Sacramento Catholic community as Principal of Sacred Heart School since 2001. He has also served as principal of two other Catholic schools in the Diocese of Monterey. From 1996-99, he served as Assistant Secretary of Education for Catholic Schools and Parental Rights Advocacy for the United States Catholic Conference in Washington D.C. In the late 1980's he taught three years at Palma Catholic High School in Salinas, California.

Mr. Burnell holds a Bachelor of Science degree in political science and a Master's degree in Public Administration from Arizona State University. He has also earned a Master of Education degree with an emphasis in Catholic Educational Leadership from the University of San Francisco. In addition to these academic credentials, Mr. Burnell is a Master Catechist with an emphasis in social justice.

This appointment comes after a thorough search process. In the coming months, efforts will be made to provide opportunities for Mr. Burnell to get to know the Christian Brothers High School community. His foremost obligation will be to the Sacred Heart School community for the remainder of the current school year.

All colleges students have been admitted to and those they will attend will be listed in the Commencement Program next month. **Parents, be sure to have your senior turn in the "Senior Survey" by either completing it online at the "Family Connection" (see website for details) or filling out a paper version at school and returning it to Mrs. Hesser as soon as possible. Students need to list ALL colleges to which they have been admitted and ALL scholarships, awards, etc. We must have this information in order to accurately recognize your child at the Senior Family Liturgy on April 24 and at graduation on May 20.**

**Sophomores and Juniors:** This spring is a good time to take the **SAT** and **ACT** exams! Sophomores, if you are completing a course you feel you have done well in (for example, AP World History, Chemistry, etc.) and want to take the **SAT subject exam**, be sure to register to take the **June 4 SAT subject exam** (the registration deadline is **April 29**; go to [www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com) to register). Juniors, if you did not register to take the **May 7 SAT exam** by the deadline, you may still register late until **April 6** (there is a late registration fee). Be sure to register for either the **SAT or SAT subject exams June 4** date by **April 29**. The next **ACT** exam is **June 11** - the registration deadline is **May 6**. Go to [www.act.org](http://www.act.org) to register.

### **SUMMER PROGRAMS -- DO SOMETHING EXTRAORDINARY THIS SUMMER!**

Summer will be here before we know it! Summer is a wonderful time for students to expand their horizons, enrich their lives with fascinating experiences, and improve their readiness for college through academic pursuits. Brothers' **Men's Tennis** team is off to its best start in YEARS with a whopping 4-0 record mid season! The team has added a healthy roster of new talent including Matt Braly and Tim Nguyen who have gone undefeated at the number three double's position! Success has also been found with the addition of Rafael Miguel to the team. Returning players make up our singles ladder, and are led by Dane Axelgard who moves into the number 1 position from 5th place last year. Seniors and co-captains Spencer Tocherman and Addison Flynn have also staged impressive wins, as have Sophomores Matt Edwards and Adam Egbert. Much improvement has also been seen by seniors Sean DeGuzman and Andy Spisak.

This year the program has added assistant coach Zan Zuna, a former player himself, who has whipped our guys into far better shape physically by having them run and do drills at least twice a week. It's Game, Set, Match for the men's tennis team so far this season! Here's to capping off the second half of our season with just as much success!

It has been a wonderful start to our **Track and Field** program. Our team is 90 strong, book-ended by an outstanding Senior class

and a very large, talented Freshman class. For the first time in twenty years, we hosted a track meet "at" CB. On March 16, we welcomed the Diamondbacks of Union Mine to Oak Park and defeated them in two out of the three divisions. We added 4 new coaches to the staff, bringing our total to 8. We are very excited about the direction the program is headed and all the support from families, teachers, and the administration.

The journey to a 2<sup>nd</sup> consecutive section title for the **Women's varsity soccer** team has begun. Although 7 key players from last year's team have gone on to college, the current team remains confident. The defense looks to be impenetrable, with talent and tenacity in the midfield, and the offense looking to score at every possible opportunity.

The **Varsity baseball** team has an overall record of 3-5 and a league record of 2-1. Our young team faced 4 ranked teams in our first 2 weeks of play. The team posted a 3-2 win over El Dorado, a game in which Tyler Wichmann threw 10 strikeouts. Cory Valine is also a mainstay on the mound with 11 strikeouts. Solid hitting has come from Valine, who has 7 doubles, and Curtis Raulinaitis, who has a team leading 8 stolen bases and 10 runs scored. Brendan Wright leads the team in RBI's with 9. We are preparing for a busy week prior to Easter vacation in which we will be playing 5 games in the Granite Bay Tournament. Following that week, we resume league play. The league should be a real battle between Oak Ridge, Ponderosa, Cordova, and CBS.

After the first meet against the CK McClatchy Lions, the **Falcon swimmers** proved themselves vicious in the water. With everybody swimming as speedy as a torpedo, the CB swim team kicked off another great season. Newcomers Monica Anderson and Katy Drack shook off their first-meet nerves while the veterans ran through their meet preparation. Many of the parents came out in support of their swimmers and volunteered their time to successfully run a smooth meet. We sincerely hope to see more of the CB family cheering us on!

The 2005 **Freshman Baseball Team** has a full roster of 19 players. With the last game at El Camino, the Frosh improved their won-lost record to 4 wins and 2 losses. But more importantly, their "baby steps" they are taking now will provide them that "varsity stride" in the future. There have been some outstanding performances during the first six games and these highlights will be a good foundational start for this pack of baseball players. We have 20 more games left in the season and we do play at home, so please come out and see us!

Pitching has been the mainstay for the 2005 **JV Baseball team**. The team is 4-2 through March 18. The JV Falcons have received outstanding starting pitching performances from Matt Cottini, Erik Currier twice, and Palmer Brown. This year's JV club boasts a fine bullpen as well, and offensively they display a great mix of power and speed throughout their lineup. The 2005 JV Falcons are one of the hardest working teams at CB, and with their pitching depth, offensive flexibility, and intense desire to learn and win, they will be a team to watch.
